Area: Nebbiolo's hills in Barbaresco

According to many experts this wine, produced from Nebbiolo grapes grown in the towns of Treis, Barbaresco, Neive and Alba, represents Barolo's younger brother.

According to others, from excellence and skills of Langa's professional winemakers. Certainly, these Nebbiolo grapes offer a respectable wine, worldwide known and worth the main pages of many famous food and wine magazines.

But the Barbaresco is a wine due to be drunk, and calls the consumer to take another glass of it thanks to its simplicity and elegance.

Aged for at least 3 years in oak barrels, this wine has a garnet Red colour, orangey, characteristic scent, ethereal, intense, it highlights primary hints of rose, violets, prunes and the barrel confers it vanilla, tobacco, cinnamon and nutmeg. Its flavour is dry, full slightly austere but velvety definitely harmonious.

After a long ageing process, let it settle for 2-3 hours before serving.

Use large goblets to oxygenate it and open the perfumes of this great red wine from Piedmont.
